
responsible by closing the classes. This helps Carol Hudson at national keep the database complete. We have been spending way too much time chasing down instructors to close classes and we should not have to do that.

Ski Area Motorized Vehicle Rules in Michigan

The new administrative rules for motorized vehicles used at ski areas (such as snow-mobiles) in Michigan have three components: use policy, training and equipment.

Use Policy – Each ski area is required to prepare a document that defines when and how motorized vehicles are to be used at their area. The NSAA's "Snowmobile Operations Resource Guide" (Catalog #3955) is specifically cited in the rule as a resource that must be consulted in the development of an area's use policy. This document and other resources are available from NSAA at (303) 987-1111.

Training – The rules require that every operator of a motor vehicle on an open ski run be trained by the area in the area's use policy.

Equipment – Flashing red lights are required (grooming vehicles need yellow lights from the requirement in the Act). Also required are alarms and flags. It may take some effort to find a way to install flashing lights and alarms

that last, but most have and everybody needs to have flags on whip antennas this season

and be working on lights and alarms this season to fully comply next season.

Other Requirements – The new rule has several other requirements:

 Operators of motor vehicle on open ski runs must be at least 18 years old and have valid driver's licenses

- Maximum speeds are to be no more than is reasonable for the conditions
- Injuries and deaths involving motor vehicles on open runs must be reported
- No private snowmobiles are allowed on open ski runs
- Skiers and pedestrians have right of way whenever possible

The new rules were filed with the Michigan Secretary of State and are now effective. Rule 2 (R 408.62) is what is new. It is integrated in the administrative rule set available from the Michigan State's web-site, www.michigan.gov/ski.

These Rules are now in place in Michigan. Other ski area managers may also want to become familiar with them, as they may be cited in other situations.

- 4) Understand that we as patrollers OWE our allegiances to the ski area we patrol. The management, lift attendants, snow makers/groomers, ski instructors, and yes we patrollers are a team. If you are a current ski patroller, new candidate or a patroller thinking about taking your Senior test this year, you should plan to attend this Ski Enhancement Seminar.





In Memoriam

Tom Landree

Tom Landree died on July 4, 2009, at Aspirus Ontonagon Hospital, attended by his family. He was 63 years old and in failing health the last few years. In spite of that, Tom was busy in his garage,



working on his projects, adding to his tool base and planning the purchase of a new tractor.

Tom was the patrol director at the Porcupine Mountains ski hill for 29 years, retiring in 2004 when the State of Michigan turned over hill operation to a private managing company. Born January 10, 1946, Tom was one of the

Ontonagon area "locals" who grew up with the hill and learned to ski at it. He joined the patrol at a young age and watched the maturing of National Ski Patrol during those 29 years. His Porkies call number was "2" so that tells you something. When Tom left the patrol about 5 years ago, his local call number was permanently retired, too.

Tom would hold court each Saturday and Sunday in the patrol room, regaling patrollers with his funny, witty, and well-crafted stories of adventures. Nothing was sacred - stories included his "Adventures with National", the various work sites his company sent him to, ordering his specially-made patrol supplies, his investigations on various subjects. He was quick-witted, well-read and interested in technology. He had a knack for figuring out com-

puters in the early days, and lots of his stories were accompanied by his hilarious graphics, some of which grace the patrol room walls today. As his good friend Mary Ross (4 on the patrol, and affectionately known as Orange) says about our stories, "A lot of it we just can't print." Some of the snippets we remember: Tom passing out crayons to color "hair" on fellow (hair-challenged) patroller Bob Clark, Tom on a snowboard, riding 30 feet before he went down, Tom having his "Mac Attack" in the lift line, Tom giving an unsuspecting patroller a prank gift or a word of encouragement, Tom's laughter heard around the patrol room, Tom & Dan "pumping them-

Each chapter is being reviewed multiple times by patrollers, EMS, physicians and outdoor medical experts. Since this is still a work in progress the price has not been established. Powerpoint presentations are also being developed to complement the text and instructor manual. A new web page will also be developed.

Low Angle Rescue on Lake Huron

Just got back from the division meeting at Mackinac Island where we held a LAR (low angel rescue class) on Saturday. Jim Markey with help from Jonathan Odell, David Zoromski and I put on the class. We had 21 participants in the class with the first part of it being held indoors.

During this section we went over equipment, knots and rigging. The second part was held out on the front lawn of the mission point resort. During this section we split into two groups and applied all the things that we had just went over in class by setting up a z-rig (a haul system for raising). I think that some people were a little surprised as they walked by and saw us pulling toboggans across the lawn with Lake Huron in view.

LAR is part the MTR program and the purpose of the Low Angle Rescue (LAR) course is to serve as a source of information that ski patrollers can use at their home areas or other situations that suite the need. As with any rescue situation, be it a Low Angle Rescue or an Outdoor Emergency Care scenario, the basics will remain the same but, the dynamics of the scenario will change with each case. The rescuer may have to work with snow anchors such as a deadman or snow pickets instead of using trees or a lift tower as an anchoring point. The rescuer may have to decide if it is faster and safer to lower the patient out rather than haul the patient up the incline. This course covers the basics of setting up anchors, use of knots and raising and lowering systems with lots of hands on.

As the season is fast approaching I see that there are already several MTR classes registered threw the Division. If you would like to see one in your area please get a hold of me rock_ski@hotmail.com or your local MTR adviser.

The leadership team is currently working to find "Common Ground" across the program and to further develop the relationships and best practices across the program. The drafted Certified Program Goals are to:

- Provide performance standards and evalu ation on a broad range of patrol skills and knowledge
- Increase patroller awareness in areas relevant to ski area operations
- Provide a readily identifiable resource of highly skilled, motivated, and knowledge able patrollers to better serve NSP, ski area management, and the outdoor recreation community through instruction and/or leadership
- Promote interaction and exchange be tween paid and volunteer patroller
- Build on, but do not duplicate, the Out door Emergency Care Program or the Senior OEC Program by providing a, selfdirected training program to develop mem ber skills

The Certified Program enables patrollers to build upon experiences gained while patrolling and through other NSP Programs. The program consists of six core modules:

- Area Operations
- Avalanche Management
- Emergency Care
- Lift Evacuation and rope knowledge
- Skiing/Snowboarding
- Toboggan handling

"The above modules may be expanded upon by Divisions to meet the additional needs of the Division"

On a more local level, the Central Division Program Plans to hold our 2010 annual meeting and evaluation at Marquette Mountain on February 25 through 28. We hope that if you have interest in the program or what we are all about, that you consider coming up to Marquette in February. If you think your patrol has great camaraderie, you will find that the Certified team takes that benefit to a whole new level! Tom kept the patrol going many years, some of them single-handedly. His friends Les Tillman and Howell Smith Sr often visited the Porkies from Afton Alps. Howell said that Tom remarked once in spite of all the differences he had with National policies and procedures, something worked well when 4 or 5 patrollers from different ski areas could work smoothly together on a rescue and be on the same page with regard to patient care.

Dennis Maslar

Ohio's Boston Mills/Brandywine Ski Patrol and the Ohio Region lost a good friend and dedicated, 32-year patroller when Dennis Mlichael Maslar, 54, of Richfield, Ohio, died Aug. 27, 2009, of a heart attack suffered

while mountain biking near Peninsula, Ohio. Dennis became a member of the National Ski Patrol in 1977 when he joined the Alpine Valley Ski Patrol and in 1991 transferred his membership to Boston Mills / Brandywine Ski Patrol.

Throughout Dennis' patrol career, he held many leadership positions at the local and region levels. At Boston Mills/Brandywine, he was instrumental in developing chairlift evacuation refresher protocols, including low-angle rescue, and headed up the annual Frosty Refresher programs. In 2001, his passion for helping our youth and engaging them in patrolling led him to found the BMBW Junior Ski Patrol, a program that is still one of the most active in the Ohio Region. In addition, Dennis' interest in keeping young winter sports enthusiasts safe prompted him to visit local schools and ski clubs to promote on-hill safety.

Since 2005, Dennis has been the current

Ohio Region Senior Program Administrator. For a number of years, Dennis, a PSIA Level I certified instructor and a toboggan trainer, was an active and respected leader within the Ohio Region NSP-C Ski School Program. A Senior Patroller and holder of National #10552, Dennis was one of the friendliest individuals you will ever meet. He possessed a quiet leadership style, and was known by all as a loyal and dependable Patroller.

Dennis was the son of Edward and Bette Maslar and is survived by his wife Diane, his daughter Katie, his son Ross and three brothers. His quiet demeanor, commitment to improving his and others skiing skills and witty sense of humor will be missed by many. A memorial fund to aid the family has been established at US Bank.



SOUTH CENTRAL EASTERN MICHIGAN

At the Fall Division meeting on Mackinac Island, the Central Division Board approved a change in timing for Region Director Elections. The Western Region Director election was moved from 2010 to 2011, leaving Region Director Elections in 2010 for South Central and Eastern Michigan. The purpose of this is to have an equal number of elections each year.

In accordance with the current Policies & Procedures of the Central Division, an election for the position of Region Director for South Central and Eastern Michigan Regions will be held in the year 2010. The Region Director serves a three year term, administers the Region according to the Region's Bylaws and Policies and Procedures and reports directly to the Central Division Director.

Qualifications:

- 1. Must be a registered NSP member for at least five years
- Must have served two terms as a Section Chief, Patrol Representative, or National, Division or Region Program Supervisor/ Administrator for at least two years.
- Must be familiar with National policies and procedures as defined in the current NSP Policies and Procedures manual.
- Must be familiar with the Region's policies and procedures, as applicable.
- Must be registered in the Division as a Senior (Alpine, Nordic or Auxiliary) Patroller or Certified Patroller.

Responsibilities:

- 1. Supports and fosters NSP mission Statement.
- Promotes and supports all NSP education programs within the Region to maintain the integrity of NSP training standards.
- As a member of the Division Board of Directors, the Region Director is responsible for duties developed and designated by the Division Board of Directors.

- 4. Responsible for all aspects of the NSP programs and activities supported by the Region.
- Promotes the financial support of the NSP and its programs.
- Visits all areas with the Region during their term of office.
- Submits an annual report to the Division Board of Directors.
- Is responsible for communicating National and Division policies to Sections and NSP Registration Units, and is responsible for communicating NSP Registration Unit concerns to the Division Director and/or Division Program Supervisors.
- Writes articles and reports for Division Newsletter.
- Ensures that all Section and NSP Registration Units submit annual reports and financial reports in a timely manner.
- 11. Recommends individuals to the Division Program Supervisors, and in consensus with them, appoints individuals to serve as Region Program Administrators.
- 12. Monitors the performance and effectiveness of Region Program Administrators and recommends changes in concert with the Division Program Supervisor when appropriate.

Nomination Procedure:

Nomination may be made by any Region active patroller in good standing or by self nomination. The nomination form can be found in this issue of the RPN or can be downloaded from the Central Division website: www.nspcentral.org. Nomination forms must be received by the Division Election Coordinator between December 30, 2009 and January 26, 2010. Nominees will be sent a "Candidate Information Sheet" that must be returned by February 9, 2010. All nominees must follow "Guidelines of Conduct for Candidates" found in the current Central Division Policies & Procedures.

ELECTION PROCEDURE:

Members of

the Division Instructor Development contingent will be lending a hand to provide additional expertise in how to more effectively "Teach Teachers".

The on the hill portion will be lead by the Central Division Toboggan Team which is made up of the nine Region Toboggan Supervisors, the Division Toboggan Supervisor and assistants and numerous highly skilled toboggan trainers from throughout the Division. The current plans are to have the same one day program available both days of each STW. The Toboggan CE program will only be conducted at the Division STW's this season and next. The locations of the Toboggan CE program for the 2011-12 season will be determined at a later date.

This new requirement is intended to help the 122 Central Division Toboggan Instructor

Trainers maintain a high level of toboggan teaching skills by continuing to expose them to new and improved teaching techniques as well as to share what's working and what isn't throughout the Division. The IT is a vital link in developing and sustaining only the highest quality toboggan instructors.

The new Toboggan CE Program will help the Central Division assure the delivery of a high quality toboggan training program to the members.

As a reminder to **All** toboggan instructors, your toboggan training instructor log is due to your Region Toboggan Supervisor each fall. If you don't provide the training log you may well be dropped from your Region's toboggan trainer list. Contact your Region Toboggan Supervisor with questions.

Come to an Avalanche Class Near You

The Central Division Avalanche Group is planning Level 1 courses in just about every region this season. Check with your local regional avalanche advisor for more information or contact me at dmihuta@fuse.net.

The Level 1 avalanche course prepares you for occasional backcountry skiing or excur-

sions off the ski area. This course can be upgraded by adding a 4 hr. component for Rescue Personnel and then you qualify for the Level 2 for Rescue Personnel held in Utah this year. There is a snow science component required to complete a Level 1 course for Rescue Personnel but that can be accomplished in Utah or by attending a one day course at Mt. Bohemia.

There is an Avalanche Level 1 for Rescue Personnel course being offered at the Divisional S&T event at Boyne Highlands on December 12th and 13th. It is a classroom session only, taught by divisional and regional
